Colon Cancer Screening Kit

Collecting the Stool Sample

- The stool specimen should be passed directly into the clean, dry, white collection container.
- Stools should not be contaminated by urine. Use the tongue depressor provided to transfer the sample into the sample cup. *Note: Do not fill the cup.*
- Screw the lid on tightly and place specimen in the biohazard bag and then in the small blue paper bag provided.
- Refrigerate the specimen if you are not returning it the same day as collected.

Returning the Stool Sample

- Within 48 hours of collection, deliver the specimen to the hospital Laboratory or one of the Sarah Bush Lincoln Walk-In locations listed below.
- Please submit a sample by April 28, 2023.

Note: A specimen should not be collected from a person with the following conditions that may interfere with the test results:

- Menstrual bleeding
 Bleeding hemorrhoids
- Constipation bleeding
 Urinary bleeding
